REGULAR MEETING

Quincy, Illinois, September 13, 2010

The regular meeting of the City Council was held this day at 7:50 p.m. with Mayor John A. Spring presiding.

The following members were physically present:

The minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held September 7, 2010, were approved as printed, on a motion of Ald. Duesterhaus. Motion carried.

The City Clerk presented and read the following:

PETITIONS

By Blessing Health System (BCS) requesting permission to conduct a raffle and have the bond requirement waived from now till 9/13/11. The City Clerk recommends approval of the permit.

Ald. Reis moved the prayer of the petition be granted. Motion carried

By the Scoreboard, 234 S. 8th, requesting permission to waive Section 18.039(4) (Permitting open liquor to leave licensed premises) of Chapter 18 of the City Code on September 25th from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. for a "Grand Opening Event" with all proper permits obtained. The north and west parking lot will be fenced in with one entrance in and out. There will be live music outdoors from 5:00 p.m. till 8:00 p.m.
