### **PETITIONS**

By Quincy Gems Baseball requesting permission to hold a **fireworks display on June 4<sup>th</sup>, July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>** at Q-Stadium after the ballgame. The Quincy Fire Department has given their approval subject to ten conditions.

By Quincy Transit Lines Interim Director requesting permission to have "No Parking by Order Chief Of Police" signs placed on Jersey between 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> starting at 5 p.m. on Friday, May 27<sup>th</sup> and continuing through Monday, May 30<sup>th</sup> at 7 a.m.. This is to prevent parking in the bus loading area at the 7<sup>th</sup> and Jersey transfer point during the Gus Macker event.
