## OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS

### REGULAR MEETING

Quincy, Illinois, March 28, 2011

The regular meeting of the City Council was held this day at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor John A. Spring presiding.

The following members were physically present:

Ald. Bumbry, Goehl, Duesterhaus, Bauer, Moore, Havermale, Farha, Sassen, Rein, Lepper, Brink, Holtschlag, Reis. 13.

Absent: Ald. Vahlkamp. 1.

Ald. Brink moved Alderman Vahlkamp be excused from this meeting. Motion carried.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held March 21, 2011 were approved as printed on a motion of Ald. Duesterhaus. Motion carried.

#### **The City Clerk presented and read the following:**

#### **PETITIONS**

By the Dogwood 2011 Celebration Committee requesting the following streets be closed for the Dogwood Festival on April 29th from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.: 5th, Maine to Hampshire; and on April 29th through May 1st from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.: Maine, 4th to 6th; 5th from north side of drive-thru lane of Mercantile Bank to Hampshire; and Hampshire, 4th to 5th, with the 5th & Hampshire intersection closing on a diagonal. They also request "No Parking" signs be posted on April 28th at the close of business with "No Parking" restriction beginning one hour prior to street closing time.

Ald. Reis moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

By the Quincy Area Chamber of Commerce requesting permission to hold the Dogwood parade on April 30th beginning at 9:30 a.m. starting on Maine at 24th, going west on Maine to 6th, north and south on 6th then disbanding. Line up of the parade will begin at 7:00 a.m. on Maine, 24th to 36th. They request "No Parking" signs be placed on Maine, 6th to 36th, and 6th, Hampshire to Jersey, at the close of business on Friday, April 29th. Rain delays are planned for 11:30 a.m. or 1:30 p.m. as the committee deems necessary on Saturday, April 30th. Organizers to be responsible for clean up of city streets after parade.

Ald. Havermale moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

By Adams County Council for Senior Citizens requesting permission to conduct a raffle and have the Bond requirement waived from 4/1/2011 through 5/26/2011. The City Clerk recommends approval of the permit.

Ald. Reis moved the prayer of the petition be granted. Motion carried.

By Quincy Area Autism Support Group requesting permission to walk down Maine Street on April 9th beginning at 10:00 a.m. starting at Quincy Medical Group parking lot proceeding down Maine Street to 5th Street using the sidewalks.

Ald. Holtschlag moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

By QHS Class of 2011 All Night Party Committee requesting permission to amend their request to hold their all night party on Friday, May 27, 2011, at Scottie's Fun Spot Family Entertainment Center instead of the Tangerine Bowl, beginning at 10:00 p.m. and ending at 5:00 a.m. They still request Section 30.401(Curfew) be waived during the night to permit participants under the legal curfew age to return to their homes without incident.

Ald. Havermale moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

By Quincy Herald-Whig and The Local Q dot com requesting permission to hold a Music Festival on May 7, 2011 at QU Football Stadium and QU Parking Lot at 18th and Sycamore. They request to shut down Sycamore, 18th to 20th, except to local traffic, from 1:45 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. with gates opening at 1:45 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. for the first event and Spruce, 18th to 20th, except to local traffic, from 5:00 p.m. through midnight due to the large number of pedestrians moving from parking lot to entrances off of 20th street and again after leaving show with gates opening at 6:00 p.m. ending by 11:00 p.m. for second event at QU Football Stadium. They are requesting noise ordinance be waived until 11:00 p.m. and "No Parking" signs along residential homes surrounding stadium grounds so patrons do not block residents' parking. Parking lot area will be fenced/roped off for vendors and people with approved drinking area and non-drinking area. All proper licenses and permits will be obtained for the event.

Ald. Bauer moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

#### **RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, the Quincy Fire Department is required by contract and NFPA standards to provide firefighters with fitness-

Ald. Havermale, seconded by Ald. Reis, moved the reports be received and vouchers be issued for the various amounts and on the roll call each of the 13 Aldermen voted yea, with 1 absent. Motion carried.

The meeting resumed its sitting as a City Council on motion of Ald. Havermale.

#### **MOTIONS**

Ald. Duesterhaus moved to allow a dumpster on city right-of-way at 905 N. 10th from now for two weeks. Motion carried.

Ald. Holtschlag referred to the proper authorities the request by Johnny Bang Bang's, 138 N. Front Street, requesting permission to have a party in the back parking lot on Sunday, April 3, 2011 from 6:30 p.m. to midnight blocking off the parking lot with constant staff available to allow anyone who needs to get into the Water Treatment Plant full access (if this is not a possibility, they ask permission to block the street in front of Johnny Bang Bang's). They are also requesting permission to waive Section 18.030(1) (sell liquor outside of licensed premises); Section 18.039(1) (consumption of liquor on public street, public alley, public sidewalk or public parking lot); and Section 18.039(4) (permitting open liquor to leave licensed premises). All subject to obtaining proper permits and licenses. They also request barricades. Motion carried.

Ald. Reis moved to allow the Quincy Fire Department to close the east end of Hampshire between 4th and 5th on the nights of March 29th, 30th and 31st from approximately 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. for parking of apparatus and safety of personnel while performing firefighting drills. They also request "No Parking" signs on both the north and south side of Hampshire in the above mention area. The time period for "No Parking" would be from 6:00 p.m. until all of the QFD crews have cleared the area at approximately 10:00 p.m. Motion carried.

The City Council adjourned at 7:47 p.m. on a motion of Ald. Havermale. Motion carried.
