RESOLUTIONS

City Engineering and Planning Director recommending Klingner & Associates, P.C. be retained under the City's Professional Services Ordinance, Section 13.1620, to provide engineering services for Bayview Bridge lighting project in the amount of \$55,000.

Police Chief, Fire Chief and Director of Administrative Services recommending that the City of Quincy enter into an intergovernmental agreement with John Wood Community College who will provide \$20,000 in cash and 450 hours worth of labor to help renovate the Quincy Transit Lines building at 1900 Seminary Rd. in exchange for a rental waiver for 6 ½ year period.

Fire Aldermanic Committee, the Police Aldermanic Committee, the Director of Purchasing, the Police Chief and the Fire Chief recommending approval of the proposal from Keck Heating and Air Conditioning in the amount of \$15,340 for the installation of an energy efficient heating and air conditioning system. 100% of the costs have been secured from the Energy Efficiency Revolving Loan and Grant Program.

City Engineer and Director of Purchasing recommending that the normal bidding requirements be waived and that the qualified and available provider, Supreme Electric Company, be awarded the task of installing detection camera systems at the intersections of 36th & Broadway and 24th and Kochs Lane in the amount of \$7,871 with \$3,935.50 being reimbursed back to the City by the State of Illinois.
