They also request “No Parking” signs be placed on both sides of Maine, 12<sup>th</sup> to 33<sup>rd</sup>, on both sides of Jersey, 14<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup>, and on the east side of 14<sup>th</sup>, Maine to Jersey, at the end of the day on Oct. 18<sup>th</sup>.
