June 2014 Employee of the Month

Officers Mike Cirrincione, Luke Humke, Chris Mueller, and Chad Scott were selected as Employees of the Month for June 2014 for their response on Wednesday, April 16th, to a reported structure fire at 515 S. 17th Street. The caller reported that she was still inside the residence and was trapped in the basement. Officers Cirrincione, Scott, Mueller, and Humke responded and upon their arrival at the residence began looking for an access point into the basement. The Officers found a basement window on the southwest side of the house where Officer Mueller used his baton to break the window to gain access to the basement. Upon breaking through the window, Officers found that a wall had been constructed inside the basement that covered the window. Officer Cirrincione started kicking at the wall material until he was able to gain access to the basement. Shining his flashlight into the basement, Officer Cirrincione saw that the basement was quickly filling with smoke. He yelled for the female to come to the window. A female made her way to the opening where Officer Humke was able to get himself into the opening far enough to grab the female and pull her through the window to safety. Once outside, the female told officers that her fiancé and infant son were still inside the house on the main floor. Finding it impossible to enter the structure, the officers made the arriving fire crews aware of the other two individuals still inside the residence and directed them to their possible location.

After making entry fire crews found the caller's fiancé and infant son just a few feet inside the back door. Both were removed from the residence and taken to the Blessing Hospital where unfortunately they were pronounced dead a short time later.

Due to their quick response and lack of concern for their own safety, these officers undoubtedly saved the life of the female caller. Their drive and determination to locate the other two victims assisted in QFD in effecting an immediate rescue, which then gave medical professionals the best chance of resuscitating the fiancé and infant son.

Though two lives were lost during this tragedy, the bravery and determination displayed by these four officers prevented further tragedy and heartbreak for the family of the victims.

The female was later released after posting bond.
- On 06/18/14, Michael W. Foster, was charged in Adams County Court with Theft Over \$10,000 Not Exceeding \$100,00, a Class 2 Felony, and was released on a recognizance bond. The charges were the result of a three month investigation by the Quincy Police Department. The theft allegedly occurred at S. J. Smith Company (formerly Central Welding Supply), 201 Spring Street, Quincy while Foster was employed there.
- On 06/04/14, officers with the Quincy Police Department arrested Isaiah D. Thomas, of Quincy for Aggravated Discharge of a Firearm, Possession of a Firearm by a Felon, and an unrelated Illinois Department of Corrections Warrant, in reference to a shooting that occurred on 5/31/14 at 15th and Van Buren. Thomas was lodged in the Adams county Jail pending a court appearance.
- In the month of June, the Quincy Police Department saw a significant increase in vehicle and residential burglaries. On June 25, officers responded to the area of 15th and Spring on a report of subjects burglarizing vehicles. Two suspects were seen fleeing the area. A 15 year old male juvenile was taken into custody. Subsequent investigation led to the discovery that several vehicles had been entered. The male juvenile was arrested on a charge of Burglary to Vehicle. He was released to a parent.
- Additionally on 06/19/14, officers responded to the area of 18th and Wilmar Orchard for two suspicious people. Upon investigation it was learned that Lenzie Picke and a 17 year old juvenile were involved in several motor vehicle burglaries and a burglary. Both subjects were lodged as a result.
