### PETITIONS

- Wards 4,7** By Quincy Senior High School Student Council requesting permission to hold their homecoming parade on September 19<sup>th</sup> beginning at 6:00 p.m. starting at 12<sup>th</sup> and Maine going east on Maine to 33<sup>rd</sup>.
