### **PETITIONS**

By Quincy Service League requesting permission to allow parking on Maine, 30<sup>th</sup> to 36<sup>th</sup> Street, and on 33<sup>rd</sup>, Maine to Broadway, on Nov. 20<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Nov. 21<sup>st</sup> from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. during their 42<sup>nd</sup> Annual Holiday Gift Show.

A revocable permit application for encroachment of city right-of-way by Bryan Young, property owner of 1004 Maine, to block the sidewalk with a debris chute and put a dumpster in the parking stall in front of his building while work is being done to the interior upper floors from Sept. 28<sup>th</sup> thru Oct. 12<sup>th</sup>. The City Engineer presents this request subject to five conditions.

A revocable permit application for encroachment of city right-of-way by K & W Painting to block the sidewalk and one parking stall in front of property located at 632 Maine while maintenance work is being done to the exterior of the building from Sept. 16<sup>th</sup> thru Oct. 21<sup>st</sup>. The City Engineer presents this request subject to five conditions.

A revocable permit application for encroachment of city right-of-way by Area Drug and Alcohol Testing to place a sign over city sidewalk at his business located at 613 Maine. The City Engineer presents this request subject to four conditions.
