### PETITIONS

**Ward 7** By Jeremy Grootens, owner of The New Hampshire Bar, requesting permission to close 10<sup>th</sup> St. between Maine and Hampshire for a one day event on June 23<sup>rd</sup> from 1:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. He requests **Section 18.039(1)** (Consumption and possession of alcoholic liquor outside on public streets, alleys and sidewalks) and **Section 18.039(4)** (Permitting open liquor to leave licensed premises) and **Section 18.030(1)** (Sell outside licensed premises) be waived with all proper licenses be obtained. A fenced in area will be set up with one entrance in and out. Barricades are requested.

**All Wards** By the three Quincy Kiwanis Clubs requesting permission to hold their 23rd annual “Peanut Day” on August 31<sup>st</sup> from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at various locations throughout the city.

**Ward 6** By Wes Neisen, owner of 819 S. 11<sup>th</sup>, requesting permission to close the west end of the alley located between 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> St., Jefferson and Washington St. during daylight hours for maintenance work on May 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>. **Ward 7** City Of Quincy Council Resolution Of Support For Sale Of Non Essential Property. (1125 S. 6<sup>th</sup> in the amount of \$1,500)

Resolution To Expend Capital Funds to purchase the SunGard-ONE Solution Community Development Software to allow integration between city departments to record, track permits and licenses as well as generate reports in the amount of \$40,000 and will be paid for from the Commercial Development Fund.

Director of Information Technology and Director of Purchasing recommending the normal bidding process be waived and the quote from HTE of Lake Mary, FL in the amount of \$46,417 be accepted for the annual software maintenance agreement.

Director of the Quincy Transit Lines, the Transit Advisory Committee and the Director of Purchasing recommending approval of the reauthorization of the purchase of 10 new bus shelters pursuant to a resolution passed on October 3, 2011.

Resolution Authorizing An Agreement To Provide Transit Services To Quincy University. (From June 1, 2012 to May 31, 2015.)

Chief of Police, the Director of Purchasing and the Police Aldermanic Committee recommending approval to purchase one blue 2005 Chevrolet Impala from the Village of Payson for \$10,000 using money in the Capital Fund.
