### PETITIONS

By the following organizations requesting permission to conduct a raffle and have the bond requirement waived: American Legion Post 37 Quincy from now to 6/8/13; Good Samaritan Home from 4/20/13 to 6/19/13; Quincy Elks Lodge #100 from now until 6/21/13; Quincy Noon Lions Club from now to 5/15/13. The City Clerk recommends approval of the permits.

- Ward 7** By the Dogwood 2013 Celebration Committee requesting the following streets be closed for the Dogwood Festival on May 3<sup>rd</sup> from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.: 5<sup>th</sup>, Maine to Hampshire; and on May 3<sup>rd</sup> through May 5<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.: Maine, 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup>; 5<sup>th</sup> from north side of drive-thru lane of Mercantile Bank to Hampshire; and Hampshire, 4<sup>th</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup>, with the 5<sup>th</sup> & Hampshire intersection closing on a diagonal. They also request “No Parking” signs be posted on May 2<sup>nd</sup> at the close of business with “No Parking” restriction beginning one hour prior to street closing time.
- Wards 3,4,7** By the Quincy Area Chamber of Commerce requesting permission to hold the Dogwood parade on May 4<sup>th</sup> beginning at 9:30 a.m. starting on Maine at 24<sup>th</sup>, going west on Maine to 6<sup>th</sup>, north and south on 6<sup>th</sup> then disbanding. Line up of the parade will begin at 7:00 a.m. on Maine, 24<sup>th</sup> to 36<sup>th</sup>. They request “No Parking” signs be placed on Maine, 6<sup>th</sup> to 36<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup>, Hampshire to Jersey, at the close of business on Friday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>. Rain delays are planned for 11:30 a.m. or 1:30 p.m. as the committee deems necessary on Saturday, May 4<sup>th</sup>. Organizers to be responsible for clean-up of city streets after parade.
- Wards 3,4** By Quincy Senior High School’s Leadership class requesting permission to host the 2013 Spring Leadership FUNd RUN 5k on April 20<sup>th</sup> at 9 a.m. The run will begin at QHS, go west on Maine to 16<sup>th</sup>, turn around and go back to QHS. They are requesting auxiliary police to assist with traffic control at the intersections of 30<sup>th</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> on Maine.
