REGULAR MEETING

Quincy, Illinois, February 4, 2013

The regular meeting of the City Council was called to order this day at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor John A. Spring presiding. The following members were physically present:

The minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held January 28, 2013, were approved, as printed, on a motion of Ald. Duesterhaus. Motion carried.

The City Clerk presented and read the following:

PETITIONS

By the following organizations requesting permission to conduct a raffle and have the bond requirement waived: Quincy Quilt Guild from now thru 4/6/13; YWCA from 2/9/13 thru 4/6/13. The City Clerk recommends approval of the permits.

Ald. Holtschlag moved the prayer of the petition be granted. Motion carried.

By the Franciscan Friars of Holy Cross Friary at Quincy University requesting permission to have their annual city wide Stations of the Cross March 29th starting at 3:00 p.m. They will begin at St. Boniface Church, walking east on the sidewalk on Maine to 12th Street, crossing at 12th & Maine and walking west on Maine to 5th crossing Maine and walking east back to St. Boniface Church.

Ald. Holtschlag moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

By Catholic War Veterans of America Post 1933 requesting permission to hold a Veterans Day Parade on 11/9/12 starting at 10:00 a.m. at 12th and Maine and ending at 5th and Maine, closing streets on Maine, 12th to 5th. They are requesting Maine, 12th to 20th, be blocked for lining up of parade units at 8:30 a.m. on November 9th.

Ald. Holtschlag moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

By Quincy Notre Dame Cross Country team requesting permission to hold the Twelfth Annual Running Raider Classic on June 22nd starting at 7:30 a.m. beginning at 10th and Jackson, going east on Jackson to 12th, south to R.J. Peters Drive, through South Park, west on R.J. Peters Drive to Gardner Expressway, east through Indian Mounds Park, north on 5th, west on Jackson to Gardner Expressway, back same route finishing at 10th & Jackson. They request to close Jackson St. 8th to 12th from 7:15 a.m. to 7:45 a.m. to accommodate the start of the race. Auxiliary officers are requested to help direct traffic at the various intersections. Barricades are requested.

Ald. Musolino moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

By the Quincy Exchange Club requesting permission to hold the 22nd Annual Gus Macker 3 on 3 Basketball Tournament on May 25th and 26th in the uptown Quincy area and closing the following streets from 5:00 p.m. Friday, May 24th to 9:00 p.m. Sunday, May 26th; **5th**, York to Vermont; **Jersey, Maine, Hampshire**, 4th to 6th. They ask the police department be given authority to tow vehicles parked in the restricted areas from 6:00 a.m. May 25th throughout the tournament.
