8a. Special Event Application requesting permission to hold the Quincy University's Homecoming Parade Thursday, October 2, 2025. Parade starts at 5:30 p.m. at 18th Street to Oak Street, turning east on Oak Street to 20th Street. The closure of 20th Street, College Avenue to Elm Street (8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.); 18th Street, Oak to Lind Street and Oak Street, 18th to 20th Streets (5:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.), and barricades are requested. The applicant has submitted all required documentation, and approval is recommended by the Department of Utilities & Engineering. **Ward 2**

8b. Special Event Application requesting permission to hold the Veteran's Day Parade on Saturday, November 8, 2025 starting at 10:00 a.m. at 12th and Maine Street and proceeding west to 5th Street.
