RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Quincy, Purchasing Department did advertise for sealed competitive bids for office supplies for all City offices; and

WHEREAS, the bid request called for pricing for our core item list and a percentage off of catalog prices; with no exceptions; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Utilities is responsible for the maintenance and repair of equipment at the Waste Water Treatment Plant; and,

WHEREAS, due to the recent failure of electrical equipment at the Waste Water Treatment Plant, the Department desires to develop a maintenance plan for all electrical equipment at the sewage pumping stations and treatment plants; and,

WHEREAS, the Department requires the services of an engineering firm to assist with the development of the maintenance plan; and,

WHEREAS, the engineering firm of Klingner and Associates of Quincy, Illinois, has submitted a proposal for an amount not exceeding \$60,000.00 for the development of the electrical equipment maintenance plan; and,

WHEREAS, Klingner and Associates has the expertise required to develop the maintenance plan in a timely and efficient manner; and,

WHEREAS, funding for this professional service is available in the 2024/2025 Sewer Fund fiscal year budget.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Director of Public Works and the Utilities Committee recommend to the Mayor and Quincy City Council that the proposal from Klingner and Associates of Quincy, Illinois, for an amount not exceeding \$60,000.00 be accepted.

WHEREAS, approximately one-hundred twenty (120) feet of 24" clay storm sewer pipe located in Woodland Cemetery was found to be collapsed and disjointed and required replacement; and,

WHEREAS, due to its location near the bluff and the bluff's instability, City crews were not able to safely make the repair with the equipment available to them for use; and,

WHEREAS, Rees Construction Company of Quincy was qualified and had the equipment and expertise required to make the repair in a timely manner under Section 44.056 of the Municipal Code of the City of Quincy; and,

WHEREAS, the repair work has been completed in a satisfactory manner and an invoice received in the amount of

\$11,218.50 for all costs associated with this work; and,

WHEREAS, funding for this repair is available in the 2024/2025 Sewer Fund fiscal year budget.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Director of Public Works and the Utilities Committee recommend to the Mayor and Quincy City Council that normal bidding requirements be waived and the invoice in the amount of \$11,218.50 from Rees Construction Company of Quincy, Illinois, be approved for payment.

WHEREAS, during a video inspection of the sewer lateral, it was determined that the sewer lateral was collapsed near the connection to the manhole that had recently been replaced by the City; and,

WHEREAS, Vinson and Sill was on-site and qualified to make the emergency repair in a timely manner under Section 44.056 of the Municipal Code of the City of Quincy; and,

WHEREAS, the repair work has been completed in a satisfactory manner and an invoice received in the amount of \$9,634.59 for all costs associated with this work; and,

WHEREAS, funding for this repair is available in the 2024/2025 Sewer Fund fiscal year budget.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Director of Public Works and the Utilities Committee recommend to the Mayor and Quincy City Council that normal bidding requirements be waived and the invoice in the amount of \$9,634.59 from Vinson and Sill of Lima, Illinois, be approved for payment.

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2024, the Quincy City Council awarded a contract for the reconstruction of South 12th Street between Jefferson and State Streets; and,

WHEREAS, upon completion of the project, a sewer lateral located at 621 South 12th was found to be damaged because of the reconstruction project; and,

WHEREAS, Rees Construction Company of Quincy was qualified and had the equipment and expertise required to make the emergency repair in a timely manner under Section 44.056 of the Municipal Code of the City of Quincy; and,

WHEREAS, the repair work has been completed in a satisfactory manner and an invoice received in the amount of \$14,786.66 for all costs associated with this work; and,

WHEREAS, funding for this repair is available in the 2024/2025 Sewer Fund fiscal year budget; and,

WHEREAS, the cost of the sewer repair will be deducted from the amount paid to the contractor that was awarded the street reconstruction project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Director of Public Works and the Utilities Committee recommend to the Mayor and Quincy City Council that normal bidding requirements be waived and the invoice from Rees Construction Company of Quincy, Illinois, in the amount of \$14,786.66 be approved for payment.

WHEREAS, the Department required special dumpster service for the disposal of dewatered biosolids generated during the startup and testing of new dewatering equipment at the Waste Water Treatment Plant; and,

WHEREAS, the Department of Utilities has received an invoice from Republic Services of Quincy, Illinois in the

amount of \$12,043.47 for disposal and dumping fees associated with the removal of the materials; and,

WHEREAS, funding for this service is available in the 2024/2025 Sewer Fund fiscal year budget.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Director of Public Works and the Utilities Committee recommend to the Mayor and Quincy City Council that normal bidding requirements be waived and the invoice from Republic Services of Quincy, Illinois, in the amount \$12,043.47 be approved for payment.

WHEREAS, the Department of Utilities has received notification from its insurance broker, Willis Towers Watson Midwest, Incorporated of Chicago, that the annual premium for the all-risk property insurance policy for a term beginning on February 1, 2025, and ending on January 31, 2026, is \$260,589.00; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works has reviewed the terms and financial summary for the policy and finds them to be acceptable; and,

WHEREAS, funding for this expenditure is available in the 2024/2025 Water Fund and Sewer Fund fiscal year budgets; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to such authority and such other authority as may be established by law, this Resolution is being adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Director of Public Works and the Utilities Committee recommend to the Mayor and Quincy City Council that the annual premium payment of \$260,589.00 to Willis Towers Watson Midwest, Incorporated of Chicago, be approved for payment upon receipt of the invoice.
