REGULAR MEETING

Quincy, Illinois, November 3, 2025

The regular meeting of the City Council was held this day at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Dr. Linda K. Moore presiding.

PRESENTATION

Contour Air First Flight

Mayor Moore asked Meki Kosin to come up and speak on her experience going on the inaugural Contour flight to Chicago last Saturday.

Meki Kosin stated that she enjoyed the flight. The jets have a lot of leg room and the flight took 38 minutes. She thanked Contour Airlines and the City for this experience.

A prayer was given and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Mayor Linda K. Moore called the meeting to order.

PETITIONS

Special Event Application from the Quincy Family YMCA for the “46th Annual Turkey Run” Thursday, November 27th consisting of one (1) mile, 5K, and 10K routes beginning and ending at the YMCA, 3101 Maine Street. They request the following street closures from 7:30 a.m. until 10:30 a.m.; Maine Street, 16th to 33rd, Jersey Street, 16th to 20th, East and West Avenue, Aldo Blvd, 22nd to 23rd, Washington Street, 16th to 22nd, Jackson Street, 14th to 22nd, 16th Street, Maine to Jersey, 16th Street, Washington to Jackson, 22nd Street, Grove Ave to Jackson, and 23rd Street, Maine to Aldo Blvd, and the City provide barricades. The applicant has submitted all required documentation, and approval is recommended by the Department of Utilities & Engineering.

A petition from Steve Williams for a Special Permit for Planned Development to allow for the outdoor storage of no more than four solar-powered light towers at 1629 South 57th Street and at a contiguous unaddressed 5.88-acre parcel to the immediate south of 1629 South 57th Street be referred to the Quincy Plan Commission, Zoned RU1.

By Fireworks Authority Inc. requesting permission to hold a fireworks display on November 7th at Greenmount Cemetery, Quincy IL approximately at 1:00 p.m. The Quincy Fire Department has given their approval.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the City of Quincy Information Technology Department to provide and maintain the City’s computer network and all connected devices; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Quincy Information Technology Department has received and prepared the new computers that were approved for purchase by both the Technology Committee and the City Council in August 2025; and, **WHEREAS**, the desktop monitors that are currently used with the Thin Clients and aging computers being replaced by the new computers are outmoded; and, **WHEREAS**, a majority of city employees need a functioning computer and working monitors to perform their duties; and, **WHEREAS**, funding for the new monitors, hardware, and cabling has been appropriated in the current fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Information Technology Director recommends to the Mayor and City Council that pricing from such vendors as SHI International, Staples, and/or Amazon be used to purchase monitors and associated accessories as detailed below:

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Mayor Moore stated that the City employees will be competing in a food drive competition from now until November 17th.

There will be a ribbon cutting at the Regional Airport for Contour Airlines and Runway 422 this Thursday.

At last weeks' Finance Committee there was an option presented from American Tower for a 30-year lease agreement on a cell tower at \$2,500 a month with a 3% increase beginning October 2026 and a \$15,000 signing bonus plus \$200 for every colocator installed after the signing date. A consensus of the council was made agreeing with this and a resolution will be presented at the next council meeting for an official vote.

Quincy Visitor Center's winter hours will be 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday thru Saturday and Sunday 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.
