Officer Kaityln Dolbeare

On March 12, 2019, Officer Kaitlyn Dolbeare was dispatched to a battery report at Blessing Hospital. Officer Dolbeare met with the victim who was covered in old and new bruises and had scratches on her body. She admitted they had been caused by her boyfriend, who was later identified. The victim stated the abuse occurred at a residence over a three hour period and only stopped after she escaped from the residence and later went to Blessing Hospital. The victim informed Officer Dolbeare she believed her boyfriend was going to kill her. Officer Dolbeare established rapport with the victim and worked for a long time to obtain the boyfriend's name and secure a statement from her. Officer Dolbeare later responded to the residence where the battery occurred and observed evidence that was consistent with the victim's statement. Officer Dolbeare located the suspect at the Adams County Courthouse and he was later lodged in jail for the offenses of Armed Violence, Aggravated Domestic Battery, and Unlawful Restraint. The Adams County State's Attorney later added the charge of Attempted Murder as well. After the original report was made, Officer Dolbeare followed up with the victim numerous times, checking on her health and mental status. Due to the strength of the case, the subject later pled guilty and was sentenced to 20 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections for the offense of Attempted Murder.
