Officer J.D. Summers

On February 9, 2020 at approximately 1254 hours, Officer Summers was sent to a location for a domestic disturbance. Officer Summers met with the victim and obtained a detailed statement of what occurred. The victim provided info that her husband was a meth user, had threatened to kill her, and was armed with a handgun. Officer Summers, believing that the male may return to the residence began watching the house. The male did return to the residence in his truck and Officer Summers tactically confronted him at gun point and gave him good verbal commands while waiting for backup units to arrive. The male was taken into custody safely and transported to headquarters where he was interviewed. The male admitted to threatening to kill his wife and pointing a gun at her. He told Officer Summers that his plan was to kill her and to kill himself and he wish he would have done it.

Officer Summers is a long time ERT member and is a very tactically sound Officer. His commitment in obtaining a good victim statement, conducting surveillance on the house, and then strategically confronting and arresting the male subject most likely saved her life as well as the suspect's life
