Awards / Accomplishments / Promotions / Appointments

Officer Zach Tuley, Officer Zach Bemis, and Officer Justin Ebbing

In March 2019, Officers Tuley, Bemis, and Ebbing began receiving information regarding John Hardy and his involvement in the trafficking of methamphetamine in West Central Illinois and Northeast Missouri areas. Officers became aware that Hardy was a large source of methamphetamine for numerous individuals in West Central Illinois and Northeast Missouri. Through the course of this investigation, officers learned that Hardy was traveling to the Kansas City, Missouri area to purchase pounds of methamphetamine, which was then transported back to the West Central Illinois and Northeast Missouri area for resale.

Officers cultivated several confidential sources that led to three separate controlled purchases of methamphetamine with a total weight of 73 grams. This investigation required officers to conduct numerous hours of surveillance and also write and serve several search warrants, which assisted with the tracking of Hardy. These investigative efforts also led to the arrest of several other subjects who were assisting Hardy with the methamphetamine trafficking. Officers coordinated with law enforcement in Lewis County, Missouri in order to obtain a Missouri state search warrant for Hardy's residence. The information that officers provided and cultivated during their investigation led to the issuance of the search warrant. On April 5, 2019, officers participated in the execution of a search warrant at Hardy's residence in Missouri. During the course of the search, officer located 476 grams of methamphetamine and \$20,720.00 United States currency. Hardy was arrested and later charged in federal court with Distribution of Methamphetamine over 50 Grams.

On June 26, 2020, Hardy was sentenced to 10 years in BOP. The dedication of these officers led to the removal of a large scale methamphetamine dealer who was negatively impacting communities in West Central Illinois and Northeast Missouri.
